Kindergarten/1/2 News

Greetings Spruce Home students and families! A big thank you to all the parents and guardians who came to see me for Student Led Conferences. It is always great to connect with you! If you weren't able to make it, please check out Edsby for a video of your child! At the beginning of November, K/1/2 students started bringing *ULFI homework practice sheets* home. The grade 1/2s are still getting used to the routine of the spelling assessments on Fridays. Stay tuned to Edsby for updates on your child's progress with the grade 1/2 spelling assessment from each Friday. In ELA, the grade 1/2s have been working hard on Sara Squirrel story sequencing of events retelling and writing activity. In K math, we have been working on our fine motor skills of printing numbers

0-10 as well as counting backwards from 10-0. In grade 1 math, we have been identifying the number that is 1 more/2 more and 1 less/2 less than a given number, as well as recognizing familiar arrangements of dots without counting them.

Grade 3/4 News

It's beginning to look a lot like winter, and even though the temperatures have been above normal, please remember to encourage your children to dress appropriately for the weather. This November, and hopefully in December, the students have been able to have some fun PE and EPBL classes outside, so it is helpful for students to be dressed properly. Students have started exploring gravity and friction in science and are going to be creating Rube Goldberg machines to test out what we have learned. In Social Studies the students have chosen a country to research and will be creating a display or slide show about what they have learned. They have been writing poetry in ELA and continue to work on developing their understanding of words in our daily time doing UFLI. With all the many activities that December brings, the month will be enjoyed by all!


Family Math Challenge

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Ed Support

Spruce Home students have been practicing different breathing techniques to help learn how to self-regulate. Self-regulation is a skill that is learned through time. One technique students know is tapping meditation. Ask your child if they remember how to do this technique and get them to teach you. This is a great technique to help when you are feeling stressed, upset, frustrated etc. This technique helps reduce cortisol levels (stress hormone) in your body.

Say an affirmation (I am loved, I am resilient etc.)

Start with your pointer and middle finger tapping 7-10 times on the pinkie side of your hand. Switch and do the other hand.

Now move to your head tapping with both hands.

Move to your temples tapping with both hands.

Now move to under your eyes.

Move to under your nose.

Now to just below your collar bone.

Now give yourself a hug and tap under your armpit.

Repeat 2 more times with a new affirmation for each time you do the cycle.

You can stop there or continue with the next part we do at school.

Relax your arms and close your eyes. Take a deep breath in and then blow out your candle. Take another deep breathe in and blow out your candle. Last time deep breath in, make a wish for the day and blow out your candle. Stretch to the sky and elongate your back. Now stretch your arms back and open up your chest.
