Grade 1/2/3 News

Welcome back Spruce Home families! We are glad to have your lovely children back in our classrooms. In my Gr. 1/2/3 combined class we have welcomed 7 new faces to SH school! We have started UFLI phonics as you may have noticed the homework pages coming home twice a week and the spelling assessment results coming home on the Friday (or following Monday). We are writing our own stories inspired by the story: There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Fly. In our EPBL stations, we had a strong science focus on motion/transportation with an Airport exploration station and an opportunity to explore the different forces (push, pull, friction). The grade 3s took the learning a little deeper with the focus of contact and non contact forces using magnets. In Grade 1 math, students are learning proper number formation as well as reviewing: saying, identifying, and sequencing numbers 11-20. In Grade 2 math, students learned to identify odd and even numbers as well as skip count forward and backwards by 2s starting at an odd number or even number. In health, we have been focusing on feelings and strategies to get back to our calm inner self when upset.


Grade 7/8 News

SLC News









