Happy December from Kindergarten!

We have recently opened a Kindergarten restaurant in our classroom! The students have been learning all about the many different jobs within a restaurant, restaurant rules and manners and healthy eating too!

We have also continued to learn about migration, adaptation, and hibernation, with a focus on the animals we see around Spruce Home and the types of adaptations certain animals will use.

In UFLI we have introduced heart words along with our letter sounds. These are common words that cannot easily be sounded out, so we learn to recognize them "by heart". Our first heart word is "the".

In math we have continued practicing all numbers up to 20, both reciting them and counting objects. We are also practicing different patterns and strengthening our subitizing skills, which is recognizing how many objects are in a group without counting them.

We are also practicing for the Christmas Concert coming up!

As the weather cools off and the snow stays, we are excited to use the sledding hill and play in the snow. Make sure you come to school well dressed!

Grade 1/2/3 News

Seasons Greetings Spruce Home families! In phonics, we have been learning about the magic 'e' or 'bopper e' for the letter sounds: a_e (cake), u_e (cube), e_e (theme), i_e (like), and o_e (home). We have been working on our sentence writing skills in ELA as well as through cross curricular activities, such as our respect unit in health. We have recently started our Safety unit in Health. In Science, we will be learning about Air and Water. In grade 1 math, we have been identifying numbers up to 50. We wrapped up learning how to identify one more, two more than a given number, and one less, two less than a given number. In grade 2 math, we wrapped up learning about ordering numbers from smallest to largest, and we are currently reviewing doubles (2+2, 3+3, 4+4, etc), which will help students when doing double digit addition. Have a wonderful Christmas break!

Grade 3/4 News

It's beginning to look like winter and the kids have been enjoying playing in the snow. Please remember to encourage your children to dress appropriately for the weather. This month in science students have been learning about and experimenting with the properties of light and in Social they have been examining an Indigenous worldview. They wrote poetry in ELA and are now working on story writing and they will continue to work on developing their understanding of words in our daily time doing UFLI. The students



enjoyed Education Week last week by dressing up for each day and ending the week with a trip to watch "Willy Wonka". December brings many special activities such as the Christmas Concert (Dec. 5th), the Christmas meal (Dec. 11th), and the Santa Store. Ms. Sylvester will be with our class until the Christmas Break, it has been so great having her in our class! We will miss her!

Grade 5/6 News

The 5/6 class is working on a Reader's Theatre to present at the Christmas Concert on Dec 5. In ELA, we are focusing on improving our writing skills through a variety of projects and essay activities. -Mrs. Ginter

Grade 7/8 News

We worked on the Remembrance Day service for a good chunk of November. Our class put in a lot of work for the assembly, but it was rewarding. It took us two and a half weeks to get all of the info ready for the assembly. We researched four things: women in war, D-day, Chief Joseph Dreaver, and the RCAF. That was fun! We were on the Chromebooks for most of the unit, and after we had the research done, we made a script. The recorded groups were women in war, Chief Joseph Dreaver, and the RCAF. The last group, D-Day. was live. If you attended, I hope you had a good time.

Now I will tell you what we have been doing for math. In grade 7, they have been doing the unit called decimals, percent, and fractions which is the thing they have been working on for most of the month. Now we are going to get into grade 8 math. They do not have the same teacher as grade 7. Last year Mrs. Stasiw was the grade 7 and 8 teacher but this year grade 8 has a different teacher: Mr. Feschuk. Grade 8 have been working on ratios and rates. That is what we have been working on in November.

The sports in November were volleyball and basketball. We had a coed volleyball team. For volleyball, we have staff with students game on November 29 to finish the season. Now, the sport we are playing going into December is basketball. We have a coed basketball team. We also have a grade 5/6 coed volleyball team. That is all of the sports we have teams for right now.

That is some of the stuff that we have been working on for the past month. Have fun and be safe as we now have snow. Drive safe and be careful in the cold because you can get frostbite. If you are going outside, wear lots of layers so you don't get cold and sick.


SLC News
